Shadi Habib Allah's exhibition at CCA explores the legacies of government welfare policies, examining how local areas adapt and survive in response to changes of city planning and strategy over time. Taking place ten months after the second fire at Glasgow School of Art and at a time when CCA's surrounding area has undergone many physical and emotional transformations, Shadi's work resonates with a changing city and street – as well as a politics of austerity – as he explores the hidden economy of corner shops. Shadi's recent works respond to the city zoning and welfare policies that resulted in food deserts in Miami, particularly in Liberty City where the artist once resided. Recent transformation and proliferation of chain supermarkets have forced corner shops to adopt new and illicit forms of trade such as exchanging food stamps and welfare cards for cash. The work responds to the aesthetics of the new economies, examining how the representation of these communities, their sociality and transactions are constantly calibrated in response to the violence, ineptitude or apathy of the state.

New works including 70 days Behind Inventory and Measured Volumes respond directly to a corner shop in Miami where Shadi previously lived and worked, recreating hollow forms and absences from the shop's tiled floor and its masquerading, rarely-sold stock. A new sound work Sound Appearance departs from an interest in how the recipients of welfare should appear, speak and act, exploring what is deemed an acceptable person-in-need.

EMILIA BEATRIZ DECLARATIONS ON SOIL AND HONEY

Emilia Beatriz draws on ongoing research between Scotland and Puerto Rico in sites connected by military occupation, land struggle and environmental toxicity. CCA has commissioned a speculative narrative based on oral histories with beekeepers and sustenance farmers. Inspired by 'historian as curandera' methodology Emilia's filmic installation - with sound design by Kiera Coward Deyell - weaves histories of empire, environmental loss, and failed infrastructure with 'healing narratives' reflecting on self-repair and moving through crisis, as a body, a collective body, an island. The work offers meditations on ecological resistance and interdependency, encoded in a moss and bee-based hum.

A series of moss infrastructures inhabit and support a haptic experience in the space, suggesting moss as medicine and metaphor; as the soft top to peat bogs covering Cape Wrath retaining carbon in the ground; as a protective layer or filter; as blankets, insulation and wound dressings; as a diaspora that germinates through the wind.

Sofía Gallisá Muriente's film Assimilate and Destroy will also be screened sporadically - a film which speaks both socially and materially about how climate conditions memory through a salty, alchemical 16mm filmmaking process. We also launch a new Spanish/English 2HB journal with poetry by Daisy Lafarge and Nicole Cecilia Delgado.


